## "SHOCKED" BY FURNISHING ALCOHOL TO MINORS



On January 29, this team placed stickers on over 3,000 containers of alcohol in five retailers in Damariscotta at our first "Sticker Shock" event of the year! Together, we helped raise awareness to adults about the consequences of furnishing alcohol to minors under 21.



"This is particularly important going into this weekend where many teens and kids will be watching the big game with family or friends and where alcohol may be present. We want to make sure all adults are aware of the consequences if they furnish alcohol to our young people," says Emily Bauer of HLC.
